Studio Description	Primarily developed in the mid-20th century before state land-use planning, Rockwood is one of the densest and most diverse neighborhoods in the Portland metro area. Currently, the neighborhood is engaged in an innovative community- centered design process to retrofit their suburban urban form based on the needs of existing residents who aspire for "development without displacement." In partnership with the Multnomah County Dept. of Community Services the studio will explore landscape futures for Vance Park, Quarry and Service Yard (collective known as the Vance Properties), developing proposals that use landscape operations and adaptive management to reclaim these degraded sites through process.
