# Business Practices in Historic Preservation

This course provides an overview of historic preservation business practices, covering the essentials in project management and consulting. While the course is primarily directed toward Historic Preservation students, those in Architecture may also benefit from discussions of business practice issues and considerations.

Students engage in practical exercises to understand the basics of project planning and execution, including proposal development and winning work, planning for field safety, and how to deliver quality projects on time and within budget. After completing the course, students will be familiar with the core business practices encountered in historic resource consulting, either as an employee within a firm or as an independent consultant.
