Historical research is a requirement for professional practice in historic preservation, and UO's Master's program requires completion of a thesis or terminal project as evidence of a student's ability to carry out this work. This course will help students develop the skills and abilities needed to design and carry out a major research project using their own thesis/terminal project as an example. Students will identify and refine their research topic, develop a research question(s) to investigate, and explore sources of information to build a research case. Weekly assignments will lead to a completed research proposal by the end of the term.

Pre-requisites and targeted student audience: This course is for students pursuing a Master's Degree in Historic Preservation. Participants should have taken AAAP510 Research Methods in Historic Preservation previously.
