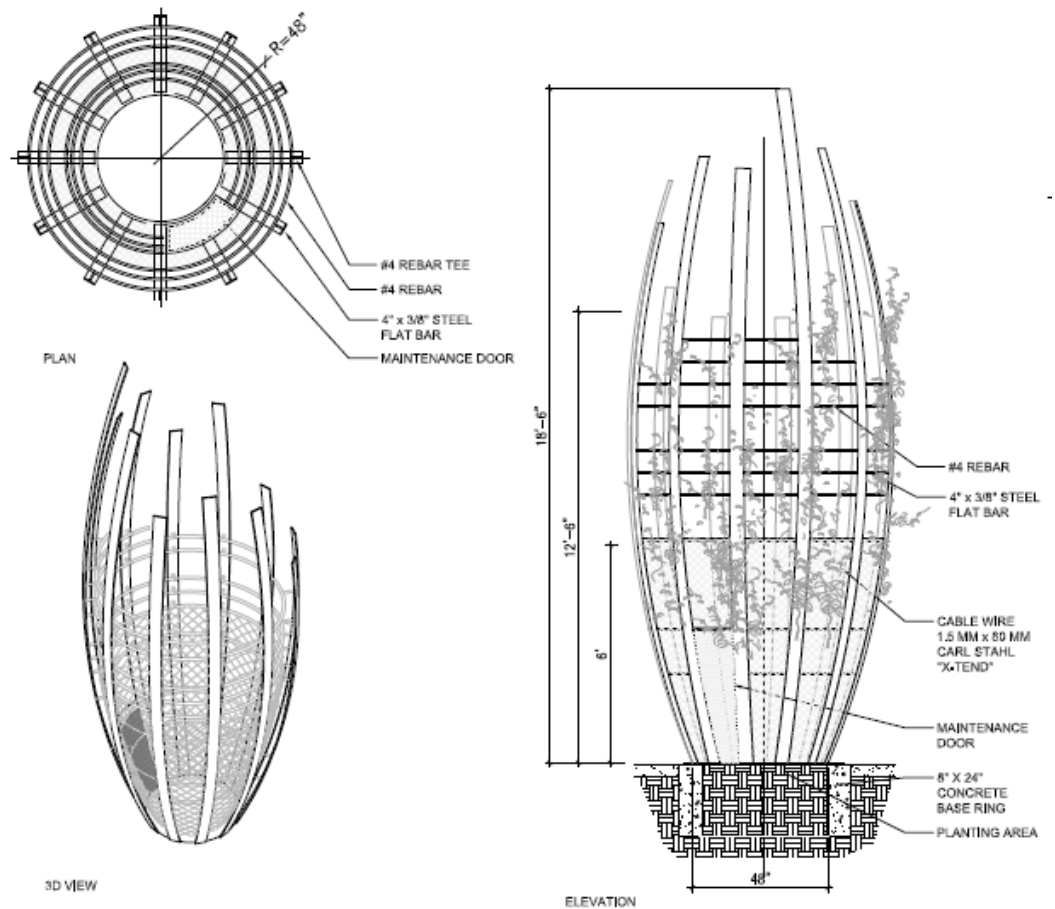

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Studio Description The preparation of architectural working drawings represents one of the major core competencies of (landscape) architects. The work requires knowledge of principles, convention standards, applications, and restrictions pertaining to the manufacture and use of construction materials, components, and assemblies. In the documentation process, the (landscape) architect must be able to make technically concise descriptions and execute drawings and other documentation for the proposed design. In this class, students will learn to develop a site plan, demolition plan, grading and drainage plan, layout plan, construction plan, planting plan and a planting details sheet. The class will review, deconstruct and rebuild the construction set for the award-winning Ishihara Park and then apply those skills to developing a set of drawings for their own design.
