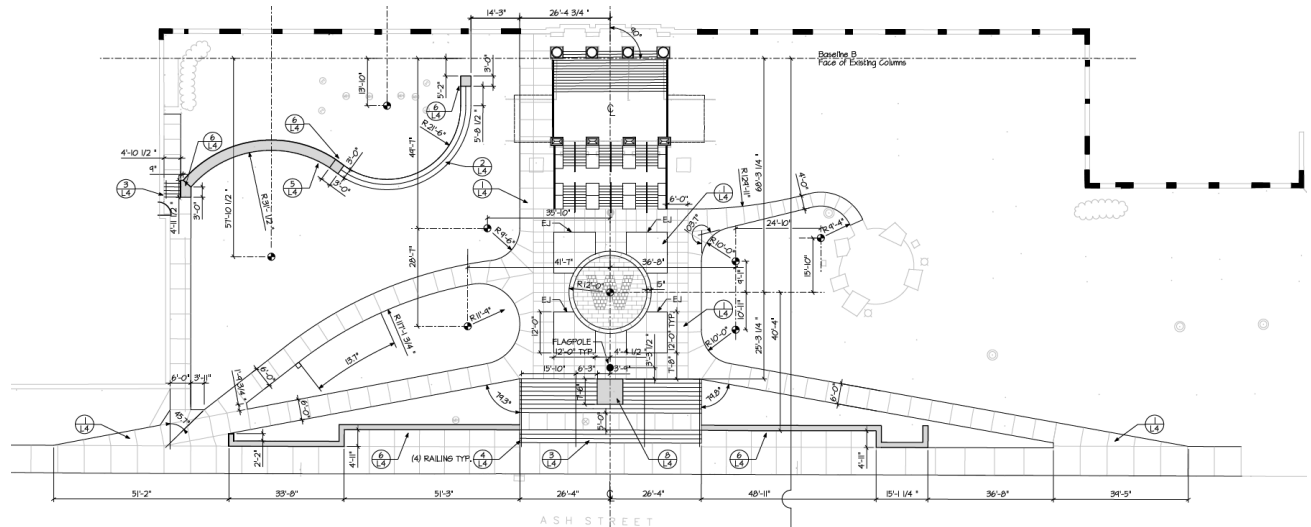

This studio is focused on the preparation of a construction drawing set. The emphasis in this class will be on the integration of your technical and design skills. This studio offers the opportunity to demonstrate your capacity to see the construction of landscapes as a complex ensemble of structural elements, plant materials, green and gray infrastructure, ecological systems, cultural relevance, climate concerns, materials, and design for diversity, equity, and inclusion.

The studio is the third term of the Oregon Sequence and will build upon previous students work for the Opportunity Learning Village. Students will work in groups and individually to develop Site Demo and Erosion Control, Grading, Layout, Planting Plan, and Details for a future houseless-shelter site.
