## BACHELOR OF INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE

## DEGREE REQUIREMENTS-225 CREDITS

The Interior Architecture program requires completion of 156 credits. This includes 70 credits in design studios and the remaining 86 credits are distributed among required professional course work and professional electives, which include the core course, history, and subject area elective requirements.
Undergraduate students are required to complete a core education, comprised of English Composition, Areas of Inquiry in Arts \& Letters, Social Science, and Science, as well as Multicultural studies. Please consult with an academic advisor for information on how to complete the University of Oregon's Core Education requirements outside of the department.
B.IARC Students are also required to take a minimum of 12 credits that are above 300 level that are not in the ARCH/IARC subject codes. This can include courses that also satisfy group and multicultural requirements, as well as any upper-division ARH courses taken beyond the ARH requirement. Weekend seminars, ART courses, and service, performance, \& studio courses are not accepted. Many upper-division courses have prerequisites.
